

BRISBANE AIRPORT

HELICOPTER AND LIGHT AIRCRAFT ROUTES Summary of Community Feedback

Airservices consulted the community about a proposal to implement standard flight path routes to and from Brisbane Airport for helicopters and light aircraft, following routes that these aircraft already fly.

The purpose of this update is to provide a summary of the community feedback we have obtained regarding the change, including how the feedback has been considered.

COMMUNITY AVIATION CONSULTATION GROUP

The proposal was presented to the Brisbane Airport Community Aviation Consultation Group (CACG) at its meeting of 5 June 2018. No feedback was provided by community representatives at that meeting.

NEWSPAPER ADVERTISEMENTS AND WEBSITE UPDATE

Information about the proposal including opportunity to provide feedback was published in the Courier Mail, Wynnum Herald, and Northside Chronicle newspapers with a link to further information in a fact sheet on Airservices' website.

SUMMARY OF WHAT WE HEARD

There was a single enquiry about the changes from a resident who was concerned about current helicopter activity and wanted further information about the proposed change.

The Airservices Noise Complaints and Information Services (NCIS) has responded to the resident's request for further information.

CONSIDERATION OF FEEDBACK

Given that there were no recommendations for changes or improvement actions identified in the feedback, the proposal will proceed to implementation on 1 November 2018.
